

Slides 01.21: Menu Card, Pitch, and Tasting Gallery

Lesson 1.21, one day, 12 slides.

Slide 1: Do now

- Write one sentence that would make your family want to eat your team's dinner.
- It has to be true. Notes: Three students read theirs. After each: can the team prove that from the plan?

Slide 2: Prove it

- "It is delicious" cannot be proven.
- "It has four MyPlate groups for \$8.70 a person" can.
- In fifteen minutes every team pitches for sixty seconds and the class votes.
- In my version of this lesson, one team wrote a jingle. Nobody has forgotten it.

Slide 3: The menu card

- The family you planned for
- Every dish name
- Cost per person: the total divided by four
- One nutrition claim, with the proof: the group, the item, the number
- Why this family would like it, using the card
- The allergen box Image: a sketch of a menu card with the six boxes laid out.

Slide 4: The pitch, sixty seconds

- Our family is ____.
- Our dinner costs ____ for four, ____ per person.
- On the plate: ____ groups.
- This family would like it because ____.
- Choose our dinner because ____.
- Every teammate says at least one line. Jingle optional.

Slide 5: Build and rehearse

- Presenter and Recorder: the menu card.
- Planner and Nutrition Checker: the claim and the proof.
- Everyone: one line on the pitch planner.
- Two teammates: assemble the tasting portions at the station.
- 12 minutes. Time your rehearsal. Notes: Check every claim against the plan as you circulate.

Slide 6: Pitch rules

- Sixty seconds. When the timer sounds, you stop.

- After each pitch, I ask the class one question: what was the cost per person?
- Listen. You will vote on fit, not on friends. Image: a timer graphic set to 1:00.

Slide 7: Pitches

- Team 1. Team 2. Team 3. Notes: Score Rubric 01 criterion 5 live on the clipboard: family, total, cost per person, plate, reason, every member spoke.

Slide 8: Gallery walk

- Three stations, two minutes each.
- Read the card first. Taste second.
- Say one kind and true thing to the station.
- Clean hands between stations.
- Presenters stay home and answer questions with numbers from the plan.

Slide 9: Sharing food with everyone

- Read the allergen box before you taste.
- A portion without cheese is on the tray if you need it.
- Nobody has to taste. Everybody reads the card. Notes: This is N&W 1. i): food sharing that shows consideration for everyone at the table.

Slide 10: The vote

- "The meal that best fits its family and its budget is ___ because ___."
- The reason counts more than the tally.
- Every team already earned its rubric score. This is one class's opinion about fit.

Slide 11: Exit reflection

- 3 numbers from your team's plan you can still say from memory
- 2 things another team did that you would copy
- 1 thing you would do differently with your own \$40 Notes: Announce the vote while they write. Three read one line aloud.

Slide 12: Tomorrow

- Ten jobs from dishwasher to food scientist. Which one would you want?
- Then the Unit 1 test. Twenty minutes. Twenty items. Everything from safety to shopping.
- Bring a pencil. Calculators for two items only.
